

VILLAGE BOARD OF ST CLOUD

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2015

The regular monthly meeting of the Village Board of St. Cloud was called to order by President Ryan Gebhart at 7:00 p.m. All board members were present. The minutes of last month's meeting were read and a motion was made by Mike Born and seconded by Dan Dreifuerst to approve them as read. Motion carried.

Utility Business:

A motion was made by Jeff Horn and seconded by Dave Schry to approve the 2016 Utility Budget for \$173,130. Motion passed. A motion was made by Troy Johnson and seconded by Mike Born to approve a raise for Dale Bink effective Jan. 1, 2016. Motion carried. The board discussed possible candidates for part-time help. 40 manhole covers have been replaced to date. Old manhole covers will be sold for scrap.

Village Business:

A motion was made by Tom Tabbert and seconded by Troy Johnson to approve the 2016 Village Budget in the amount of \$220,392. Motion carried.

Jason Sippel, representing Riverside Hunt and Fish Club, was present to discuss the DNR public land sale.

A motion was made by Dave Schry and seconded by Troy Johnson to approve the 5 year Street Plan. A copy of the plan is part of these minutes.

A motion was made by Jeff Horn and seconded by Mike Born to approve the proposal from Zehren Electric in the amount of \$3550.00 to upgrade the lighting in the Village garage. Motion passed.

The board approved a survey map for Jeff Fuhrmann property.

Dan Dreifuerst researched the minutes from 1986-1988 regarding the retaining wall located on the St. Isidore property. Information found will be forwarded to the church.

The board discussed refurbishing the Christmas decorations. Weather stripping on the big firehouse door has been done. The small side doors will be done next week. River Lane needs gravel and grading in the spring.

Time cards were reviewed. Committee reports were given.

A motion was made by Mike Born and seconded by Troy Johnson to pay the monthly bills.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 8:40 p.m.
